Power & Compassion, Working with Difficult Adolescents and Abused Parents by Jerome Price, M. A. \$25.95; 196 pp. The book offers techniques and theory

that allow family therapists to be both understanding and determined in their work with aggressive teens. It shows winning strategies for parents dealing with emotional and physical abuse by their difficult and violent adolescents; how demoralized parents can be undermined by well meaning professionals anxious to be understanding.

School Experiences of Gay and Lesbian Youth, edited by Mary B. Harris, PhD. \$29.95, hardcover, \$14.95, softcover. 115 pp. Haworth Press. This volume presents the diverse experiences of sexual-minority youth with research and case studies. The need to understand the dearth of role

models, how to incorporate the topic of homosexuality into educational curricula, forms of homophobia (from the victim's and the aggressor's points of view) and heterosexism in the high school environment.

Culture, Peers and Delinquency, edited by Clifford O'Donnell, PhD. Softcover, \$24.95; 92 pp. Haworth Press. Explores the interplay of historical, traditional culture with contemporary youth culture. It demonstrates how peers can serve as a path to delinquency from a multiethnic perspective. It shows that many commonly held beliefs about cause and effect may be less than accurate.
